# Accommodations Specific to Graduate/Professional Students

# Comprehensive/Qualifying/Candidacy Exam Accommodation

- First, determine which steps you need to take to receive exam accommodations.
  - Ohio State: Follow the typical exam process by requesting accommodations through your Access Specialist (or College Liaison, if applicable)
  - Third Party Organization (example: GRE, MCAT, LSAT): you must submit all exam accommodation requests via the third-party organization. If you need medical and/or accommodation documentation to provide to this third-party organization, please contact your assigned Access Specialist.
- Please contact your Access Specialist (or College Liaison, if applicable) in advance to make arrangements for all comprehensive/qualifying exam accommodations.

#### Thesis/Dissertation/Oral Defense Accommodations

- Please contact your Access Specialist to request accommodations (e.g., non-normative time) for your thesis, dissertation or oral defense.
- Disability Services will work with your academic department to make an individualized consideration of your request. Therefore, it is important to submit your request as soon as possible. This will help to ensure we have enough time to determine and coordinate appropriate accommodations.

## Field Placement/Internship/Clinical Accommodations

- Please contact your Access Specialist to request additional accommodations for field placements, internships or clinicals.
- Since this accommodation involves working with a third-party organization and often includes consideration of technical requirements, it can take time to identify appropriate accommodations. Therefore, it is important to submit any accommodation requests a minimum of 4 weeks prior to the start of the placement, internship or clinical.

- Graduate/Professional Student Recruitment Initiative (GPS): The Ohio State University's premier diversity recruitment program for students considering post-baccalaureate studies at Ohio State. It serves as a conduit for specialized information and helps to contribute to the ethnic, cultural and academic diversity of Ohio State's Graduate School and Professional Colleges.
- Annual Graduate & Professional Student Orientation & Networking Reception: A
  convocation and reception held the first Thursday night of autumn semester. Welcoming

  dual degree programs (grad & prof), particularly underrepresented populations, who
  have made progress on their terminal degree dissertations and /or writing projects.
   Faculty and former Boot Camp participants who have graduated play a key role in serving
  as faculty preceptors/administrative mentors.
- Preparing for the Professoriate Retreat: This retreat aims to create a sense of community and connectedness for its participants, particularly underrepresented graduate students across the university. It also provides a scholarly atmosphere of support where doctoral students can share and receive ongoing feedback on their research and professional interests, assists students with goal setting and outlining of a professional plan. Participants are given instruction on maintaining a balanced life as they matriculate, how to structure their CV, funding their research, and strategies to publish their findings, among several other important topics.
- Tenured Faculty Panel Discussion: Graduate and professional students are provided the opportunity to hear from and ask questions of some of the university's most prominent and experienced faculty concerning terminal degree completion, their career goals, and how to successfully follow that distinguished path.
- Additional Opportunities for Professional Growth: Other annual events offer graduate and professional students additional opportunities to become involved outside of the classroom such as the President and Provost's Diversity Lecture and Cultural Arts Series, the National Conference on Diversity, Race, & Learning, and ODI's Dialogue and Discussion Series.
