Student Life Disability Services proudly serves student veterans by offering academic support services to students with qualifying conditions.



SERVICES OFFERED

Services include (but are not limited to):

- **Accessible Media:**
Resource center for faculty/staff to provide their course materials in accessible formats
- **Accommodations Consultation and Advocacy:**
one-on-one interaction with an Access Specialist to review academic accommodations, discuss concerns with classes/instructors, etc.
- **Assistive Technology:**
computer screen enlargement, speech-to-text programs, etc.
- **Attendance/Deadline Modifications:**
Reasonable amount of flexibility with absences, exam dates, deadlines and participation points for students with qualifying conditions.
- **Disability Parking/Adaptive Transportation:** parking accommodations and referrals for curb-to-curb transportation
- **Exam Accommodations:**
extended test times and distraction reduced testing environments
- **Interpreting/Transcribing:** coordination of interpreting and/or transcribing services for students who are D/deaf or hard of hearing
- **Note-Taking Assistance:**
audio recording of lectures or access to peer notes

ELIGIBILITY AND REGISTRATION

In order to be eligible for services, students must have a qualifying condition.

Qualifying conditions include (but are not limited to):

- Anxiety
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Deaf or Hard of Hearing
- Concentration/Processing Challenges
- Depression/Bipolar Disorder
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)
- Physical Injuries/Limitations

Registration in now way impacts or affects VA disability rating or benefits.

Registration is confidential. No medical information is shared with other faculty or staff.

Students have the autonomy to choose with whom their registration status is disclosed. SLDS will not make contact with faculty/staff unless specifically requested by the student.
